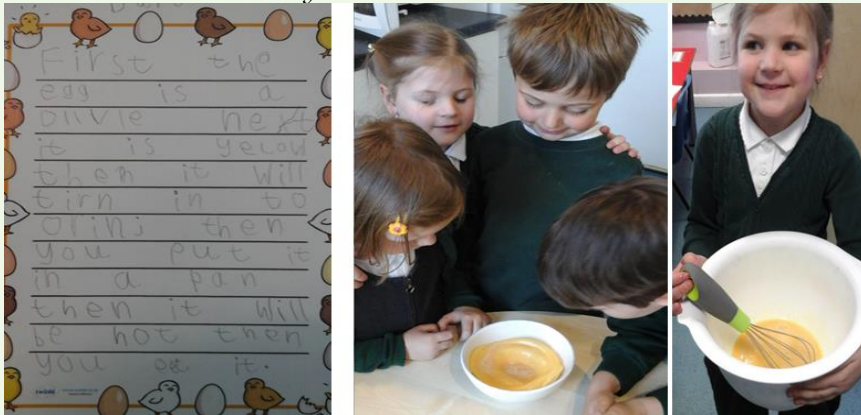


EARLY YEARS NEWS

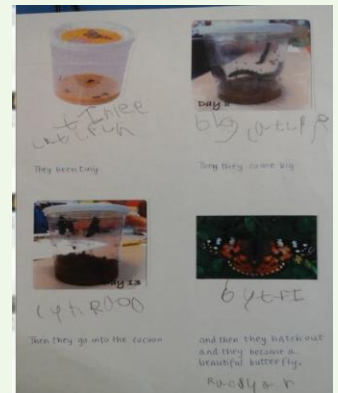
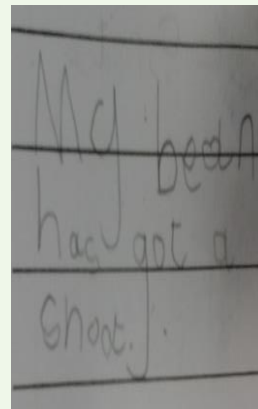
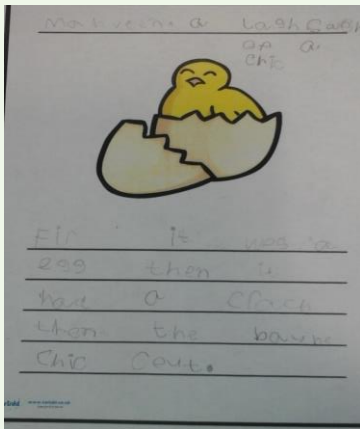
Plea to Parents

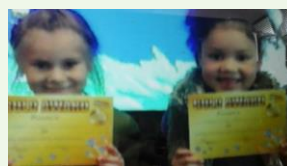
Golds and Silvers

On Your Way to School



Talk to your child on the way to school about what you see.

You can play 'I Spy' using initial sounds..... 'I spy something beginning with c...c... and your child has to guess what it is e.g. ...c car.

Or you can segment, split the word into sounds.. 'I spy something that sounds like... /b/ u /s/ c/a/t d/o/g or /t/ /r/ /ee/ and see if they can blend the word together. For the older children try even longer words.

Have fun with your sounds this weekend when you are out and about.
