Science

In Science this half term, Year 1 are learning about the human body.

- We will identify, name, draw and label the parts of the human body. We will learn about the parts of the body associated with each of the senses.
- Children will also develop their critical thinking by working scientifically. They will be encouraged to identify, group and classify as well as use secondary sources to investigate problems.

Maths



In Maths, we are continuing with the Inspire Maths programme (for more information, Google "Inspire Maths OUP"). The programme focuses on a mastery approach where all children will develop a deep understanding of topics before moving on.

This term we will focus on number, addition and subtraction.

Humanities

In History, we will be learning about changes in living memory. We will be finding out about how we have changed over time and what life was like when our parents and grandparents were young!

In Geography we will be learning about our local area.

Art and Design

The children will have access to a wide range of resources with which to design and make products. They will be taught a wide range of techniques. Children will be encouraged to share and discuss their ideas. They will also be introduced to the work of a number of artists.

R.E.

In R.E., our topic is Hinduism and Diwali.

English



Phonics: In Year 1 children will have daily phonics sessions. We follow the Letters and Sounds programme using Read Write Inc resources.

Writing: Children will work on their writing during focus groups each week. In addition, adults spot opportunities for children to apply those skills during free-flow activities.

Spelling and Grammar: The children are focussing on full stops, capital letters and finger spaces.

Reading: The children will read with an adult four mornings per week to develop their comprehension, speaking and listening skills.
