Science

Topic: Forces and Magnets

- Looking at what forces and magnets are and how we use them in daily life.
- Why there are two magnetic poles and whether they will attract or repel each other.
- Finding out about why and how magnets are attracted to only some materials.
- *Investigation:* To sort magnetic and non-magnetic objects.
- Topic: Animals including humans
- Looking at how living things get their food.
- Explaining why animals need nutrients and how they source them.
- *Investigation:* To group animals by diet.

Maths

-Number:

- Reading, writing, partitioning and ordering two and three-digit numbers, explaining what each digit represents..

-Calculations:

- Partitioning three-digit numbers into multiples of 100, 10 and 1 in different ways; adding or subtracting mentally combinations of two and three-digit numbers, developing understanding of the empty number line in respect of addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. Adding or subtracting mentally.

-Shape and space:

- Recognising and using right angles to describe turns and corners of shapes

-Using an applying:

- Identifying the operations needed in simple one-step word problems. Finding halves and quarters of numbers and quantities
