Also on Wednesday, the Nursery children went to Reception to enjoy some time in their garden.


Year one have been looking incredibly grown up this week, working at their table's independently. Their rooms have been arranged slightly differently, but all the resources have remained and still easily accessed.

We have been doing lots of building with different bricks and blocks. We have been learning lots of mathematical and positional language when we were building our structures and finding ways to solve problems about how we would reach up higher. We have been counting how many bricks we have used and finding the number on our number square.

### **RECEPTION**

On Monday Ms Panesar made playdough with the children. At this time of year, the expectation is that they should be able to write down what they need to make it. Boris, Micky and Nimota made some great lists as they added their ingredents.





In Maths we have been talking about the properties of 3D shapes, learning to describe their features, for example, how many faces, corners and edges they have and what shape they are. Please ask your children to find different shaped objects at home and see if they can describe them.

This week on the field we explored different textures using crayons and paper to rub tree bark. The children described the trees as 'rough' or 'smooth'. They discovered many types of tree bark to rub.

Yusra and Fizza told us they celebrated Eid and showed us their Menhdi Patterns.

We have also been looking at different environments around the world that people live in. On Tuesday Luciano's grandma came in to talk to the children about Italian Culture.





We will also have other visitors coming in over the term to talk about their jobs. If this is something you would be interested in, please let the reception teachers know.

On Thursday Liz, Beatrice's Mum came in to talk to the children about Yoga. The children really enjoyed her demonstrations and tried out some of their own moves.

This week, Year 1 have started their transition into Year 2. We have all been learning maths and English at tables, like the older children in the school.

We have also continued to prepare for our phonics test next week and wish all the






